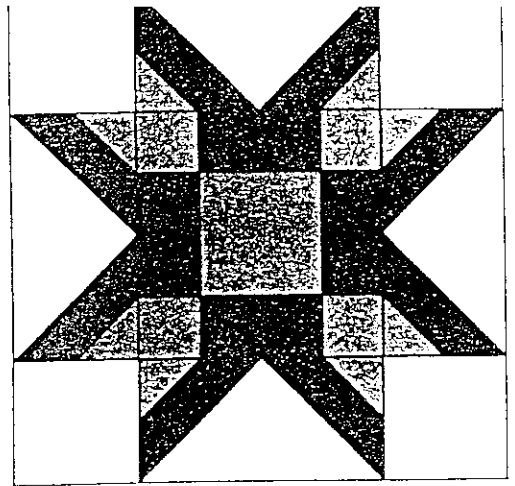

Start with a light colored print for the background; add a medium print (maybe a large print for the center and star point centers. Then a contrasting dark tone on tone or print for the accent sections.

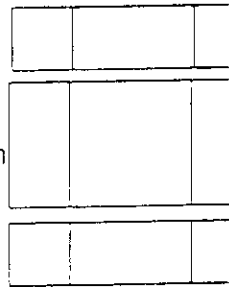
Do not use flannels : We will use cotton.

Choose quilters flannels for this, not baby flannels or chamois cloth. Chamois is often displayed at the stores with flannel, usually in solid colors. It is much too heavy and stiff for quilts. And do prewash your flannel. It is notorious for shrinkage.

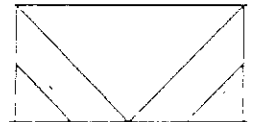
Cut: Background four 3 1/2 inch square for corners one 7 1/4 inch square, cut twice diagonally
 Medium one 3 1/2 inch square four 2 inch squares
 Dark two 3 3/8 inch squares, cut twice diagonally to yield 8 triangles
 four 3 1/2 x 2 inch rectangle eight cut from template below



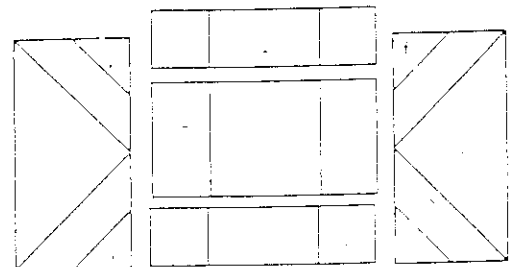
Center unit: 1. stitch a 3 1/2 x 2 inch rectangle to each side of the 3 1/2 inch square
 2. stitch a 1 1/2 inch square of each short side of the remaining two 3 1/2 x 2 inch rectangles.
 3. stitch together in rows as shown here:



Star points and center triangles: 1. stitch each template cut piece to a medium triangle
 2. stitch one of the star point units to each short side of the background triangles to make the unit shown here:



Assemble: Piece in rows as shown below.
