GOOSE CREEK


(Very scrappy, use a variety of fabrics).

Fabric A dark/medium prints (10) 2 ½" squares

Fabric B light prints (8) 2 ½" squares

(2) 6 ½" squares

Fabric C dark blue print (8) 3 ½" squares











Place a dark blue 3 ½" square, right sides together, lined up with the upper left corner of the light 6 ½" square. Mark the diagonal and sew in the direction shown. Trim off excess seam allowance

and press the remainder towards the corner. Now sew another 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " blue square to the opposing corner in the same way, and then to the two adjacent corners. Square to 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".



Lay out the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " dark/medium prints and light prints as shown. Sew 3 horizontal rows and then sew the 3 rows together. Make 2 like this.

Sew these nine patches along with the square in a square blocks made above into the 12 ½" block (12" finished) shown to the right above.



This quilt was made using 12 blocks in a 3 x 4 grid. With a $\frac{3}{4}$ " inner border and a 4" outer border, it finishes at 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 58 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".
