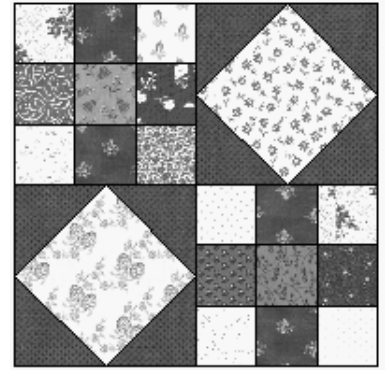


## FEBRUARY

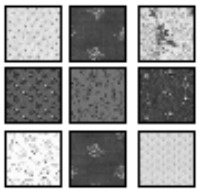
### GOOSE CREEK

(Very scrappy, use a variety of fabrics).

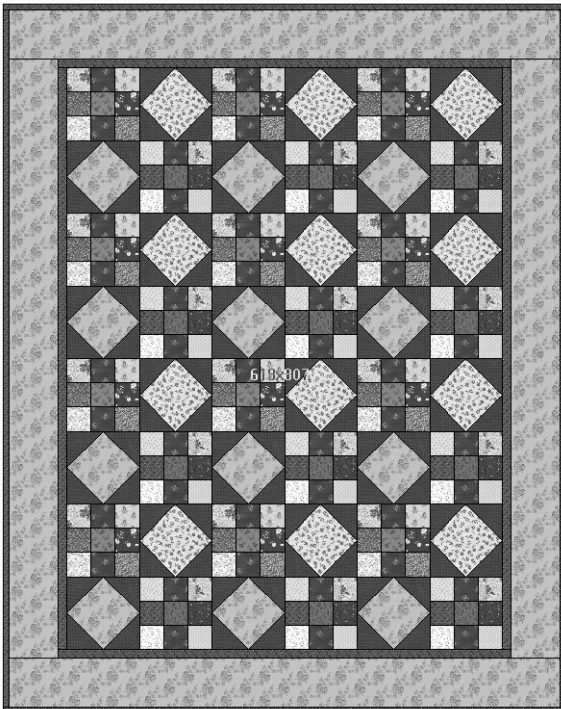
|          |                    |                                      |
|----------|--------------------|--------------------------------------|
| Fabric A | dark/medium prints | (10) 2 ½" squares                    |
| Fabric B | light prints       | (8) 2 ½" squares<br>(2) 6 ½" squares |
| Fabric C | dark blue print    | (8) 3 ½" squares                     |



Place a dark blue 3 ½" square, right sides together, lined up with the upper left corner of the light 6 ½" square. Mark the diagonal and sew in the direction shown. Trim off excess seam allowance and press the remainder towards the corner. Now sew another 3 ½" blue square to the opposing corner in the same way, and then to the two adjacent corners. Square to 6 ½".



Lay out the 2 ½" dark/medium prints and light prints as shown. Sew 3 horizontal rows and then sew the 3 rows together. Make 2 like this. Sew these nine patches along with the square in a square blocks made above into the 12 ½" block (12" finished) shown to the right above.



This quilt was made using 12 blocks in a 3 x 4 grid. With a ¾" inner border and a 4" outer border, it finishes at 46 ½" x 58 ½".
