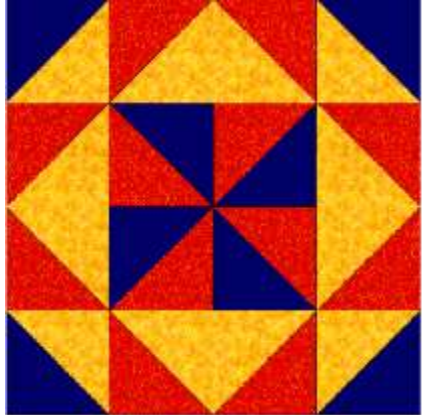


NOVEMBER 2017 BOM

STORM WARNING

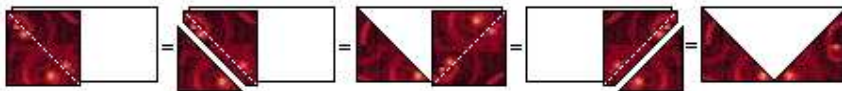


Dark blue	Four 4" squares
Red	Eight 3-1/2" squares Two 4" squares
Yellow	Two 4" squares Four 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

1-Half-square triangles: Stack each Red 4" square on a Dk blue 4" square, right sides together. On the back of the top square, mark a diagonal line and stitch a scant 1/4" above and below the marked diagonal. Cut apart on the marked line and press seam towards the DK blue fabric. Trim unit to measure 3-1/2". Repeat with the Yellow 4" squares and Dk blue 4" squares to make a total of 4 red/blue and 4 yellow/blue half-square triangles.

2-Pinwheel unit: Using block diagram as a guide, sew 4 red/blue half-square triangles into a 4-patch pinwheel unit (this will measure 6-1/2" square).

3-Flying geese units: Stack a Red 3-1/2" square on the right lower corner of a Yellow 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangle, right sides together. On the back of the red square, mark a diagonal line and stitch on the marked diagonal. Cut off the excess seam allowance. Press seam allowance toward red fabric. Repeat on left lower corner of rectangle. Make 4 flying geese (3-1/2" x 6-1/2") units.



4-Assemble units into rows using the block diagram as a guide: Rows 1 and 3 – Sew Yellow/blue half-square triangle + flying geese unit + yellow/blue half-square triangle. Row 2 – Sew flying geese unit + pinwheel unit + flying geese unit. Press seam allowances in alternating directions.

5-Sew rows together to complete block. Block should measure 12-1/2" square.

*BONUS * Fast Flying Geese Units: To construct four units at a time – Cut one Yellow 7-1/4" square and four Red 4" squares. Check out this YouTube video for instructions!
