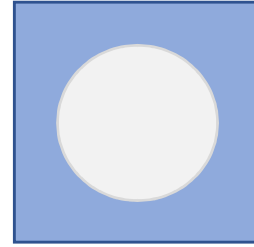


The 30th anniversary is the pearl anniversary...so our
November Block is “Pearls”

Make four 6 ½” cut (6” finished) sized blocks

We will do this block with a finished edge applique technique that uses stabilizer to help turn your edges. You will need a light weight sew-in stabilizer.



Cutting for 4 blocks:



Medium Blue background fabric: Cut four squares 6 ½” x 6 ½”

Cream or Pearl fabric: 4 scraps larger than the circle template

Trace the template below onto the stabilizer.

Layer stabilizer and pearl fabric right sides together.

Sew on the line you traced.

Trim around the circle leaving about ¼” seam allowance.

Carefully pull the stabilizer away from the fabric and cut a small slit in the center of the stabilizer circle. Be careful not to snip your fabric.

Turn inside right. Use a chop stick or point poking tool to smooth the seam around the circle.

Use a warm iron to press the circle so the stabilizer does not show.

Center the circle on the square of background fabric.

Use thread that matches your pearl to blanket stitch or zig-zag stitch around the circle.

Make 4 blocks.
