## NOVEMBER: Sunflower Chain

Color A: Cream print background: (1) $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square
(8) $2 \frac{112 \prime \prime}{2}$ squares

Color B: Medium yellow/gold print: (1) $51 / 2$ " square
(2) 5 " squares

Color C: Brown print: (1) $41 / 2$ " square
Color D: Medium green prints, scrappy: (8) $21 / 2$ " squares
1.) Using the cream and scrappy green $21 / 2$ " squares make (4) four patch blocks. The four patch units should measure $41 / 2 "$ when done.
2.) Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the $51 / 2$ inch cream square.
3.) Match up the cream square with the yellow square, right sides together. Sew a $1 / 4$ " seam on both sides of the marked line. Cut apart on the marked line and press seam to the dark side. There should be 2 half square triangle blocks. Do not trim.
4.) Draw a diagonal like PERPENDICULAR to the seam on each half-square. You do not need to square up at this time. (Picture below.) Pair up each half square triangle with a yellow 5 " square, right sides together. (They won't be the exact same size you will trim them later.) Sew $1 / 4 "$ seam on each side of the marked line. Cut apart on the marked line. Open and press toward the larger yellow triangle. There will be four units. Trim each unit to $41 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ square.
 (step 4 finished)
5.) Arrange all units in rows according to the diagram. Sew each horizontal row together with a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam. Pin rows together and sew with $1 / 4 "$. Press.
